Beginning Watercolor Painting

- 140# pound 100% cotton watercolor paper, any cheap watercolor notebook for practice and notes
- Watercolor brushes buy one or two of the best you can afford
- Watercolor paints buy Windsor Newton Cotman (these are student grade) brand if these are out of your price range buy the best you can afford
- Water cup maybe 2
- Paper towels more than you think
- Pencil and eraser
- Masking fluid I will show you the kind first class.

Intermediate Watercolor Painting

- Paper only 100% cotton paper minimum #140
- Watercolor brushes the best you can afford
- Watercolor paints the best you can afford
- Water container I use 2
- Pencil and eraser
- Masking fluid
- Paper towels.



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Suggested Supply List

Classical Drawing

- 2B Graphite Pencil or 1 Set of “Artist Pencils” ranging from 9B-9H
 - 1 Large Drawing Pad
 - Tabletop Easel or Drawing Board
 - General Charcoal Pencils or a set of 3 Charcoal pencils with soft, medium, and hard. Either “Traditional Wood” or “Peel and Sketch”.
 - 1 Pack of Vine Charcoal
 - 1 Pack of Compressed Charcoal
 - 1 Kneaded Eraser & Polymer Eraser
 - 1 Chamois cloth (Auto detailing cloth - buy at Walmart in the auto department)
 - 1 Exacto Blade
 - 1 Sheet of fine sandpaper
 - BBQ Skewers
- Optional: Proportional Divier

Oil & Acrylic Painting

- (6) 9x12 Canvases
- Oil or Acrylic Paints (your choice) 1 Tube of 37 ml Titanium White, 1 Tube of 37 ml Ivory Black, 1 Tube of 37 ml Yellow Ochre, 1 Tube of 37 ml Terra Rosa or Burnt Sienna, 1 Tube of 37 ml Ultramarine Blue, OPTIONAL COLORS: 1 Tube of 37 ml Viridian Green, 1 Tube of 37 ml Cadmium Red; Gesso
- White Taklon Paint Brushes - 10 Piece Set
- Palette Knife
- Paper Towels Roll
- Palette Paper pad or Roll of wax paper
- Liquin - Only if using Oil Paint
- Turpenoid - Only if using Oil Paint.
- Silicoil Brush Cleaning Tank - Only if using Oil Paint



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Suggested Supply List

Slow Stitching

- Fabric scraps, preferably cotton, linen, wool and silk
- Leftovers from sewing or embroidery projects
- Clothes that can no longer be worn
- Vintage fabric
- Any other fabric you might have around your home
- Embellishments, depending on what you have available to you
- Buttons
- Beads (large enough for your needle go through)
- Rick rack
- Ribbon
- Lace/ doilies
- Textured yarn
- Batting and/or felt
- Sewing scissors and small embroidery snips/scissors
- Needles
- Embroidery size 7 or 8
- Chenille size 24
- Straight Pins/ sewing clips/ pin cushion
- Thread
- Sewing machine thread in a neutral color
- Embroidery floss
- Perle Cotton
- Crochet Cotton
- Optional: A water erasable pen or friction pen or chalk pencil
- Optional: Hoop

Bring what you have, don't go out and buy anything.
The instructor will have enough for you to get started.
